

Barry's records indicate that he returned from Mexico to Payson in the spring of 1900. The following year he wrote of his first trip to Idaho with Brother James H. Hart of Bloomington, Id. They were met at Montpelier, a train terminal, by a buggy. They were taken to the Hart home in Bloomington, traveling through Ovid and Paris. He indicated they had a good time visiting. Hart's wife was Lizzie Thomas, Barry's cousin from Cardiff, Wales. He stayed with the Harts a few weeks and also had a nice visit with his old friend Edward Burgoyne, staying three nights at his home in Montpelier.

In 1903 he returned to Montpelier to visit his daughter Minnie Perkins whose husband, John T. was teaching in that city.

About this time frame, within a few years, Barry sold his house on Utah Avenue and moved into the home of Lewis, his son. Lewis lived just a few blocks to the south and west on the creek. Barry paid to have the home enlarged with additional rooms downstairs and a bedroom upstairs for his use.

These are the last of Barry's travels which were written in his largest journal which ended up in the possession of George T. Wride (George adds some of his memories of his father, Barry which writings are dated in 1943 and concludes with three sentences dated July 1958. Some of the text of his memories are included in this history brief. The full text can be read in the Journal section of this book. These pages are typewritten text done by the Archives section of the Harold B. Lee Library at Brigham Young University, to which G.T. Wride donated the original journals.) We know from George's writings that Barry visited him, (George T.) in Raymond, Alberta, Canada in 1905. He lived eight years beyond that trip to Canada.

Barry continued his writing in another journal after a period of not writing. He continued his writing in 1908, with the following entry, "20th [June] 1908 Visited friends in Salt Lake City and returned home in the evening. Effie Perkins came to Payson."

From his daily entries it appears that Barry continues a very active life for a man of seventy five years old. He works in the fields and gardens; travels near and far to visit family and friends; attends to his church meetings and even preaches occasionally; attends holiday celebrations and social events throughout the valley and corresponds with his family members. 1908 was the year that daughter Annie and her children were stranded in New Zealand with no means of support or transportation back to her homeland. She and Barry some had correspondence by way of telegraph and funds were sent to her. When she arrived in Vancouver, BC, Canada Barry again received a telegraph for instructions. Barry advised her to join her husband, who was with or near to her brother George T. at Raymond, Alberta. He again provided the necessary funds to complete her journey and reunite that family.

On Tuesday September 8, 1908 Barry recorded an interesting event—he went to Provo to visit his brother-in-law David John, and together they went to the "Wild West Show" and saw *Buffalo Bill*.

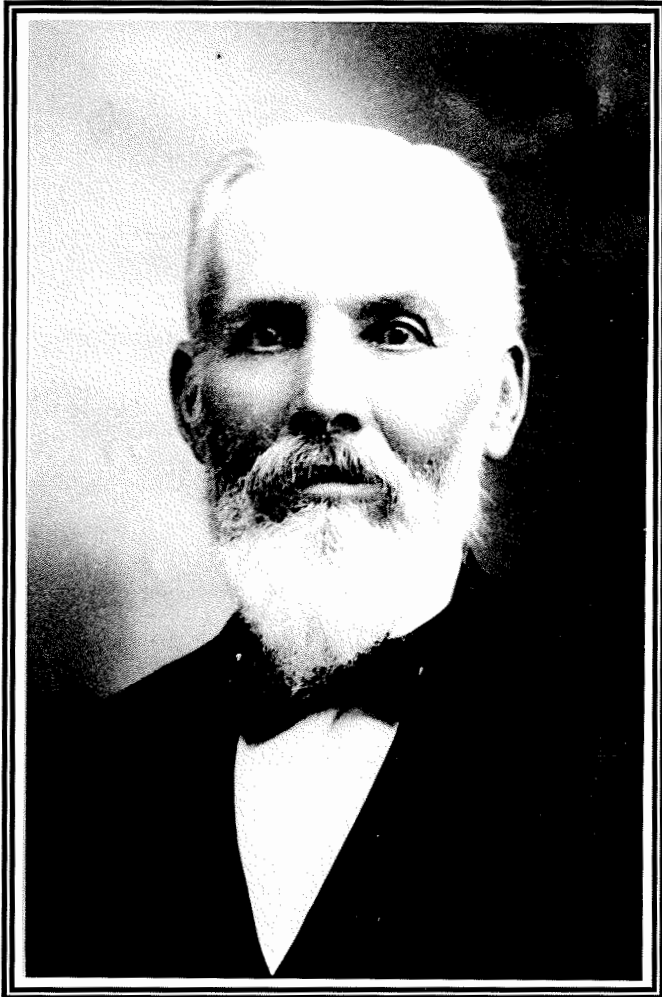
On November 8 Maggie sent a check for \$27.61—a reimbursement for a portion of the funds to emigrate from New Zealand. Maggie wrote to her father on a regular basis.

During this year and the following year many of Barry's old friends, relatives and acquaintances passed away and Barry was usually called upon to be a "bearer," chaplain, speaker or prayer. Near the end of 1908, during the Christmas Season Barry received word that his brother-in-law, David John had died. This word came on a day that Barry was planning on going to Provo, possibly to visit David, however the weather was quite adverse, so he stayed in Payson. Barry was called on to dedicate the grave.

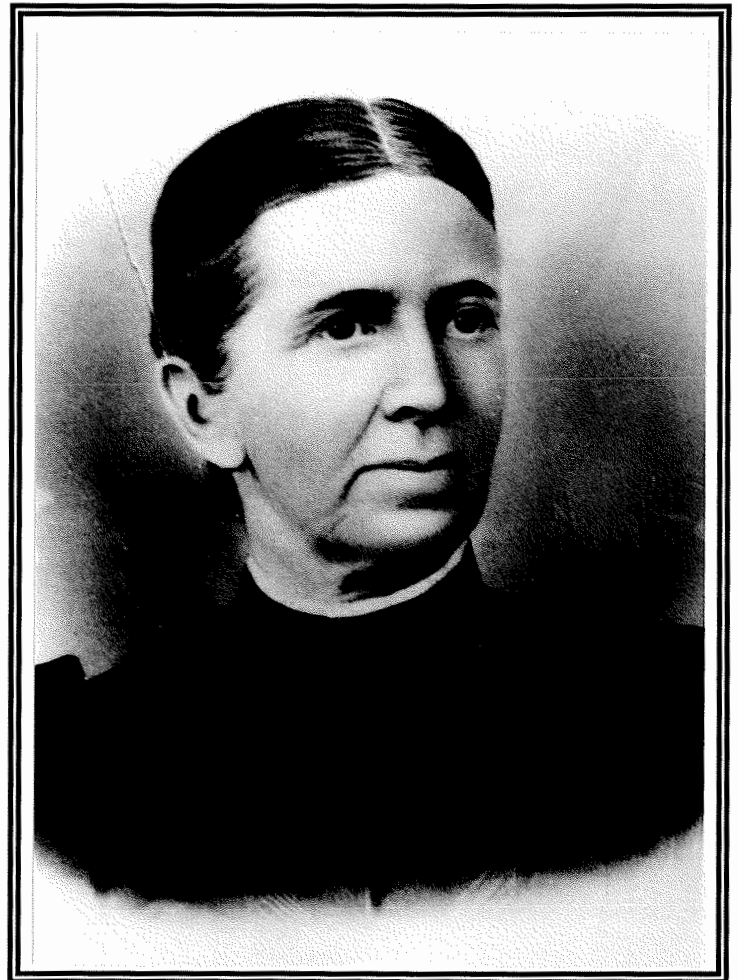
As time pressed on Barry continued active doing his favorite things—attending his Church meetings on the Sabbath Day; gardening and helping in the fields; visiting relatives and friends in Idaho and nearby cities; attending holiday celebrations. His last entry in 1911 was on August 11 in one of his small journals—it states: "I wrote to Bro Burton of my intended tour to the North—Montpelier Idaho— twas hot weather— I was ailing but was determined to make the trip.

Based on his active life in these latter years we must conclude that he continued attending church activities and meetings, socializing and puttering around the house and yard until he died on the eighth of March in 1913 and was buried in the Payson Cemetery on the eleventh of March. It was fitting that his final resting place should be the cemetery over which he was Sexton for many years and in the community where he served most of his adult life.

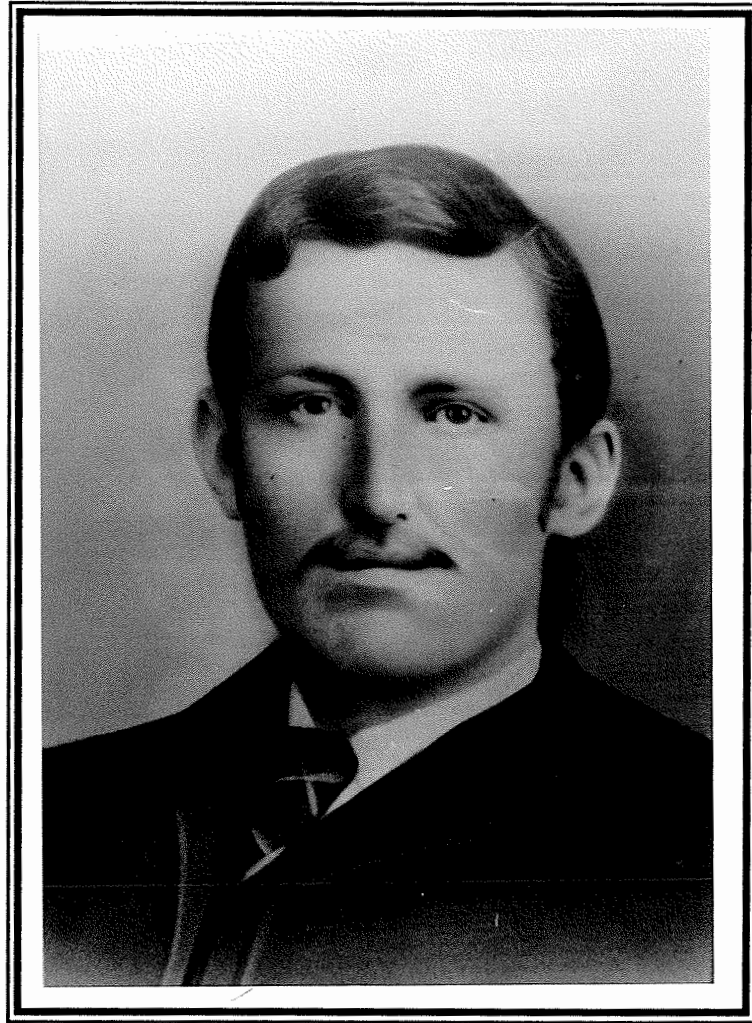
