Leone's grandfather, William Bath, and grandmother, Eve Morgan Bath, were married in Scranton, Pennsylvania March 31, 1860 and left almost immediately for Utah. The trip was their honeymoon. They left Florence, Nebraska, in June with the John Smith ompany consisting of 359 people and 39 wagons. They arrived in Salt Lake Valley, Saturday, September 1, 1860. Her grandfather also brought with him his Mother, two sisters and two brothers, but they returned to the East because of the many hardships here.

The first year here her grandfather worked in Cottonwood for board and room for himself and wife. But the next year they obtained some land in Salt Lake city, where they lived the rest of their lives. Times were very hard and for several months they did not even have a camp kettle; but finally they were able to get one in exchange for grandfather's \$75.00 watch and chain. Her grandfather, with his own hands, made the adobes out of which he build his original home. He was a miner by trade and did this work for many years, discovering the Buckhern mine at Ophir, Utah. At one time this was the largest or at least one of the largest producers. He was lame during his later years, having suffered an injury to his knee in the mine which made it impossible for him to do any work except take care of his place and raise a garden.

They were quiet, unassuming people, taking their greatest pleasure in their children and church. Met grandfather's first wife, Eve Morgan, died on rebruary 14, 1873 and in November of the same year. The died he married Mary rierce. The court had not been appropriate with 3 little buby different with the bary was the son of simon Bath and Marie watts. He was born in boys. August 1833 at Poulton, somersetshire, England. He joined the Church

in Wales when he was 20 years old. He came to America three years later. His wife, Eve Morgan, was a daughter of Daniel Morgan and Mary Todd. She was born at Merthyr, Tydvil sputh wales on June 15, 1842. There were six children born of this union, Leone's rather being the third. fourth

His second wife, Mary Pierce, was a daughter of Thomas Pierce and Margaret Thomas. She was born in Glamorganshire, Wales, May 31, 1851. She dame to Utah with her parents in 1862. To this union there were nine children born. It was a coincidence that both wives died on Valentine Day.

Leone's grandparents went to many of the shows in the salt Lake Theatre, paying their admission in produce. They loved music. He grandfather had a good voice. He often sang. Two of his favorite songs seemed to be "Juanite" and "O My Father".
